## Youth Making An IMPACT!

Some of the most positive changes in our community are not with the new restaurants, street signs, or landscaping but with our youth. We have a nationally recognized organization right here in our neighborhood that's investing in our youth and it's really making an impact.

Throughout our neighborhood, Community IMPACT! Nashville is providing youth with skills, education and a network of support to improve their quality of life and strengthen our community. Community IMPACT! takes a core group of youth ages 15-24 who is identified by teachers, principals, residents and other youth in our community and is given leadership training with community service, financial management education and college scholarships. Some of these youths are the first in their families to have a savings account or even learn about going to college. They go through an educational process of attending class once a week for eight weeks and completing at least 20 of community service in our neighborhood. And this is just where they begin. These youths have done everything from organizing events and creating job-shadowing opportunities to being youth entrepreneurs. Anderson Williams, the Youth and Neighborhood Organizer explained that the goal of Community IMPACT! is to create a network of support for our youth; a place where they come not just to hang out but to become empowered and make change. Community IMPACT! is not a citywide program, it is specifically focused in East Nashville and its purpose is to take one neighborhood and make a difference that can be seen and felt by ALL of its residents. To truly see our community change we need to invest in the youth of today because they will be our leaders of tomorrow.

LSNA would like to thank DPW Construction and Hawkins Partners for presenting the Gateway Bridge and Shelby Bridge Projects at the May general meeting. The Shelby Bridge will serve pedestrian and bicycle traffic and will be equipped with pedestrian furnishings and overlooks to the river. Julie Mathes of Hawkins Partners described many of the details of the bridge and surrounding greenways. Some of the railings along the bridge, for instance, have been designed to resemble the original railings that graced the bridge long ago. The railings at the overlooks have been designed by a local artist to reflect the history of the area. The hope is that the bridge will not only serve as a connector to downtown but as a place to gather as well. The new Gateway Bridge will primarily serve vehicular traffic once served by the Shelby Bridge and will create a connection to the interstate from downtown.

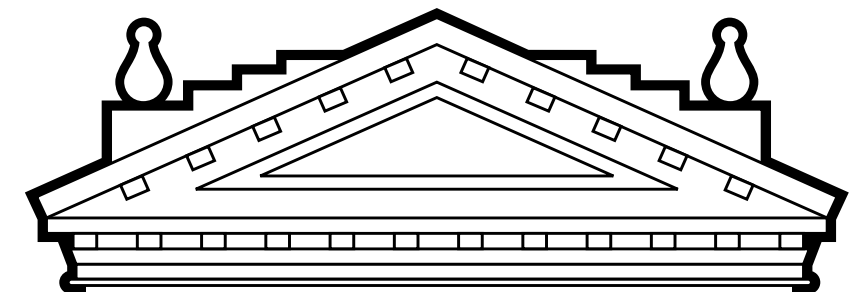
