GO BALD FOR A GREAT CAUSE

Would you be willing to shave your head if it could benefit a child with cancer? St. Baldrick's (<http://www.stbaldricks.org/>) presents the opportunity to realize this.

On October 30th, from 11 to 4, Nashville's very first St. Baldrick's event will be held in conjunction with Woodland Presbyterian Church's Fall Festival at 211 North 11th Street in East Nashville. On this day, volunteers who have vowed to have their heads shaved show up to fulfill their promise. The event has been named Team Teddy as a memorial to a 9-year-old whose life was cut short by cancer, but participants can choose to honor any child who is or has been affected by cancer.

Aside from group shearing, the day will also hold music, food and fun for all ages. Newly shorn heads can elect to have them adorned with hennas or paints—perhaps with a seasonal motif.

Started in 2000, St. Baldrick's is the largest volunteer-driven fundraising program for pediatric cancer research in the world. Three reinsurance executives decided to turn their company's St. Paddy's Day party into a benefit; the organization now funds more grants in childhood cancer research than any other group except the government. Although St. Baldrick's events have been held all over the world, this will be a first for Nashville.

East Nashvillian Paige La Grone Babcock is the first woman to volunteer for the barber's chair. "To shave my head seems such a small and insignificant gesture in context. I may look really ugly. But my heart won't feel ugly. I'm just putting the razor where my mouth is."

REJOICE SCHOOL OF BALLET: THE LITTLE ENGINE THAT COULD

Tickets are on sale now for an upcoming performance of "The Little Engine That Could." The original ballet, produced by Rejoice School of Ballet, is a part of their ten year anniversary celebration.

The ballet, choreographed by Nashville Ballet dancer Robert Poe, will include 12 Rejoice students as the toys as well as students in wheelchairs as the engines as well as costumes and sets designed by Eric Harris, who recently retired from Nashville Ballet after 15 years as a principal dancer.

Rejoice, a non-profit ministry in East Nashville, has been offering quality, affordable or free ballet lessons to hundreds of low-income students since 2000. Approximately eighty-six percent of Rejoice students come from single parent families and seventy-five percent are on the free or reduced lunch program, all of whom receive a scholarship.

"I started Rejoice in 1999 because I knew there were many talented children who would like to study ballet whose parents could not afford the cost of lessons, dancewear and costumes," said Patricia Cross, founder and director of Rejoice. "I had no money to start with and it somehow miraculously came when we needed it."

Rejoice offers ballet, jazz funk, tap and African dance classes. Classes are held at Edgefield Baptist Church, East Park Community Center, Salvation Army and Glenn Enhanced Option School.

"Here we are today celebrating our 10-year anniversary and I feel grateful that we have been given the opportunity to help so many beautiful children and their families over the years," Cross said. "Rejoice School of Ballet changes lives through dance."
