
GO BALD FOR A CAUSE

Would you be willing to get bald if it could help a child with cancer? St. Baldrick's Foundation makes this possible.

Last October, Nashville's first ever St. Baldrick's event was held here on the east side. Although the initial fundraising goal was set at \$2K, over \$21,000 was ultimately raised to benefit pediatric cancer research. This year, Woodland Presbyterian Church will again host the 2nd Annual St. Baldrick's Fundraiser and Fall Festival on October 29th from 11 to 4. Heads will be shaved as continuous live music is played which will include Carey Ott, Homemade Water, and Stoned Soul Revival among others. Food, crafts, and activities for children will augment the fun.

St. Baldrick's Foundation contributes more money to pediatric cancer research than any other organization other than the US government. One of the ways dollars are raised is through events such as these. Volunteers receive pledges to have their heads shaved in solidarity with kids who may have lost their hair while undergoing cancer therapies.

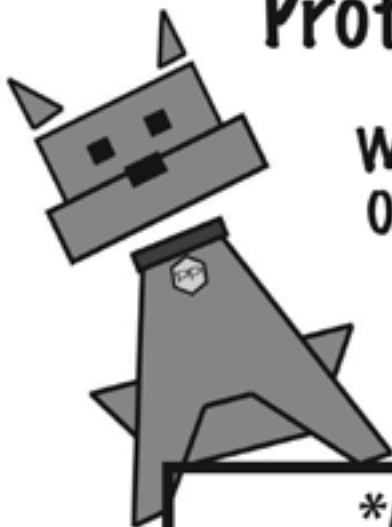

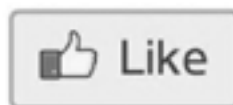


